

# Community and Neighborhood Workshops



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A central component of the Wilson Pedestrian Safety Action Plan is a comprehensive outreach and education program intended to communicate pedestrian safety principles to a variety of audiences – children, older adults, motorists, and the general public. To support pedestrian safety and walkability, the partners can take this effort to the next level by providing interactive workshops and presentations to groups that are interested in improving the safety and walkability of the community. In addition to organized neighborhood organizations, there are a variety of other stakeholders that may be interested in these workshops.

  - Schedule workshops with local groups
  - Provide meeting space, refreshments, and workshop materials
  - Lead workshops, presentations, and walkability audits
  - Help organizations communicate results of workshops (e.g. recommendations and findings) to the appropriate City staff
